Nature of support 2012/2013

The funding received from Pupil Premium has been allocated in the following ways to support learning interventions across the school:

- > Funding to maintain additional, focussed intervention in Literacy and Numeracy for pupils.
- > Increase teaching assistant support to increase targeted support in phonics, reading and identified interventions.
- > Retain EMTAG teacher one extra day per week.

FSM pupils achieved in line with other pupils nationally in Reading and in Maths but slightly below others nationally in Writing.
