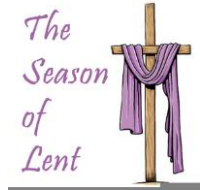

## HELP TO KEEP OUR STREETS CLEAN AND SAFE

Many parents have alerted us to the amount of dog mess on the road and pavements near school.

**Any information you give to the council will be confidential.**

### YOU CAN HELP BY ALERTING THE COUNCIL:

- Keep a note of the day and approximate times that the dog fouling is occurring. Many offences occur early morning or evening, but it's very useful if we know which.
- Write a description of the person in charge of the dog and the type of dog they were walking.
- Did they arrive in a vehicle - if so what colour and type and is this a regular occurrence?
