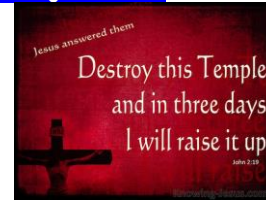

"ENTHUSIASM"

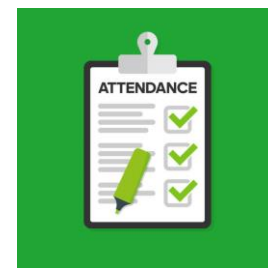
