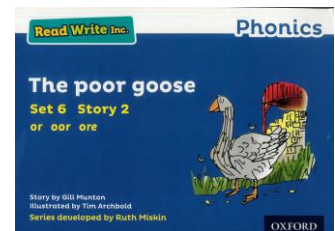
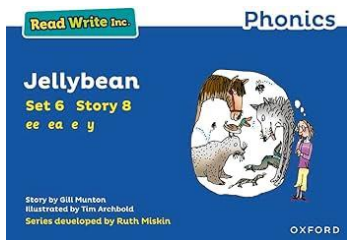

Nursery	We have live caterpillars in Nursery. We are observing them daily to see how they grow and change. What amazing differences we have noticed each day!
Reception	In Reception class this week, we have been counting in 2s and making pairs. Numbers are fascinating and help us in so many ways each day.

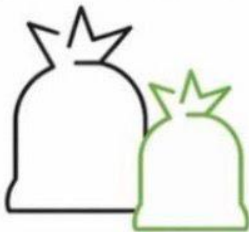

- ✓ Garden waste.

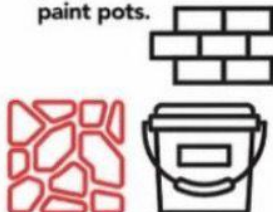


- ✓ Recycling: paper, glass, plastic, cardboard, clothes and aluminium.

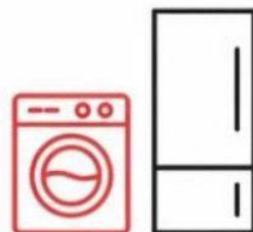


WE CAN'T TAKE:

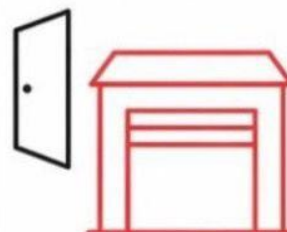
- ✗ Building materials such as rubble, concrete, sand, bricks, slabs, plasterboard, full paint pots.
